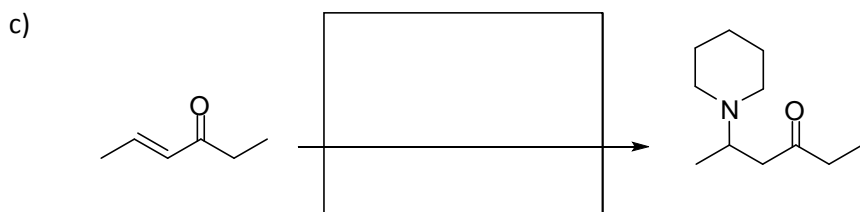
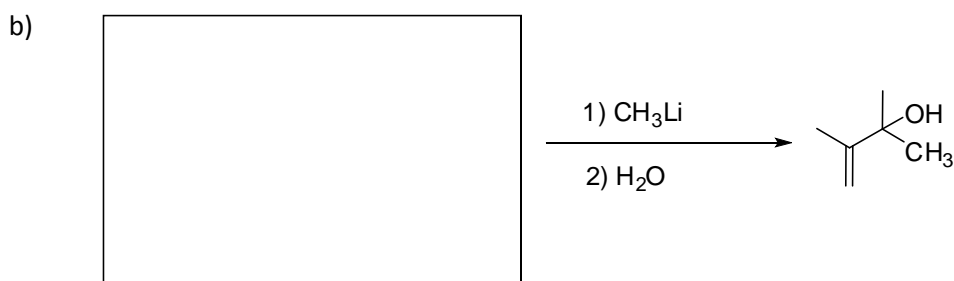
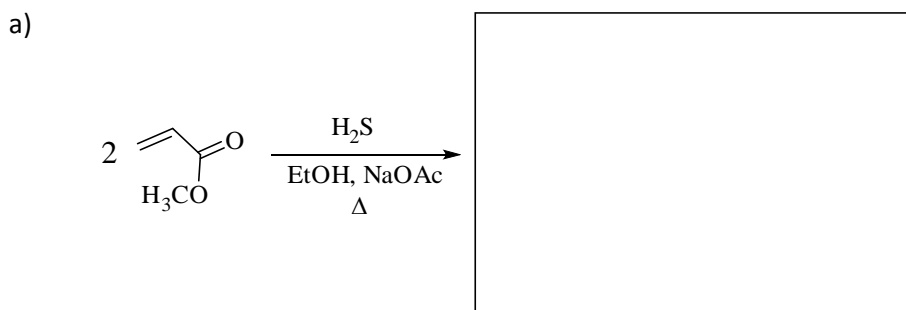
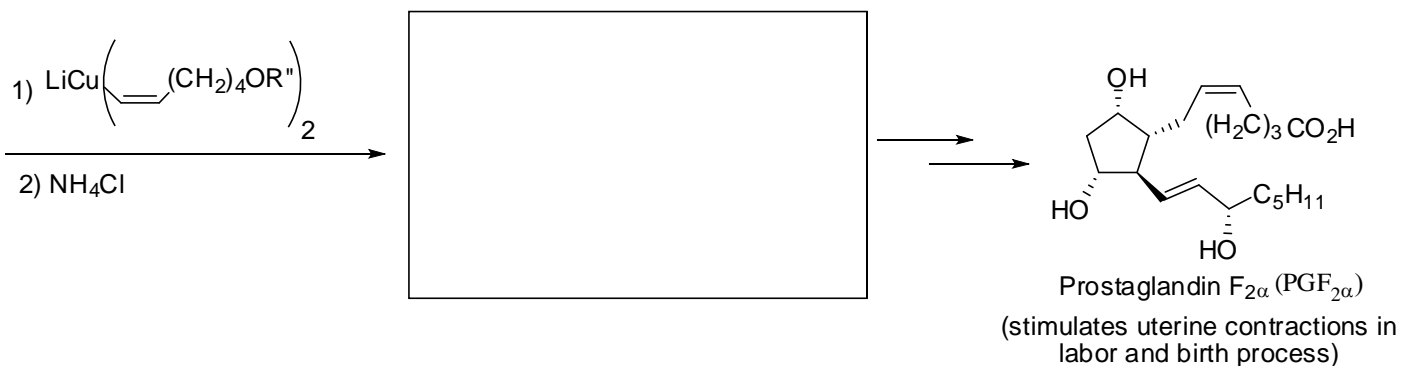
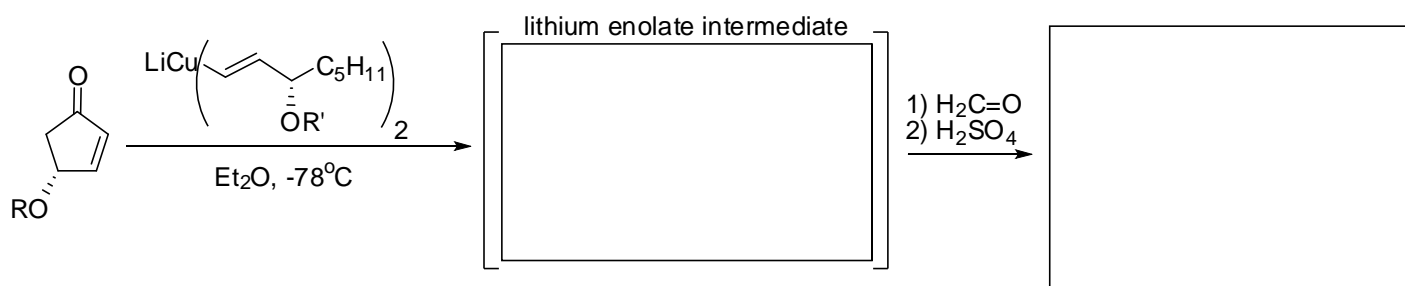


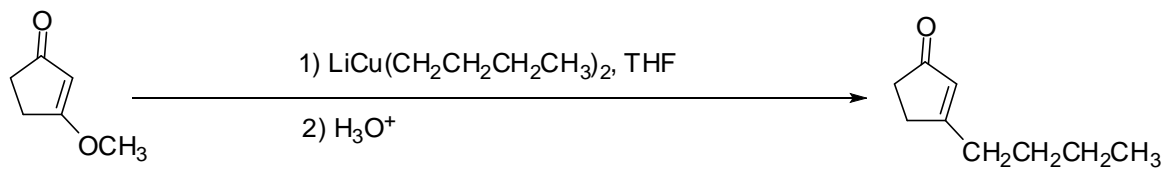
1. Provide the necessary information, product(s), reagents or starting materials, to complete the following reactions.
