## QUANTITATIVE SKILLS (CHECK ONE)

Q courses which carry divisional credit may count towards both the quantitative requirement and the relevant divisional requirement.

## LANGUAGE (CHECK ONE)

## DIVISIONAL REQUIREMENT

### **Important notes regarding transfer credits:**

With the exception of the College Seminar and Foreign Language requirements, students **are permitted** to use transfer credits to fulfill requirements. Please consult your dean in advance about whether a particular course at another institution will fulfill a Bryn Mawr requirement.

College Seminars must be taken at Bryn Mawr.

For all languages taught at Bryn Mawr, students must complete these courses here (or at Haverford). If taken elsewhere, these courses will not count as fulfilling the requirement, and the student must still pass a proficiency test. For languages not taught at Bryn Mawr, students may use coursework from Penn. If classes are taken at a university other than Penn, the student must pass a proficiency test offered through the Penn Language Center or by special arrangement with another university. Consult your dean.

### **Important note regarding interdivisional courses:**

Courses identified as interdivisional, e.g., "I or III" may be used by a student to satisfy either one of the relevant divisional requirements. However, no one course can be used towards more than one divisional requirement. Moreover, ordinarily only one of the two courses used to satisfy any divisional requirement may be such an interdivisional course.
