AIDS Fund supports organizations in the Philadelphia Region that provide AIDS and HIV-related services, education and prevention. We do this by organizing volunteers to raise and distribute funds, and through increasing public awareness of HIV/AIDS issues. In 1987, volunteers from Philadelphia's lesbian and gay community center, Penguin Place, decided to organize a walk-a-thon to support area AIDS agencies and raise public awareness about the disease. The Delaware Valley's first AIDS Walk raised \$33,000. Since then, AIDS Fund has raised more than \$11 million and is the largest private funder of AIDS service organizations in the region.
