**Fields of Study:** In Buenos Aires: Anthropology, Archaeology, Economics, Film Studies, Gender and Sexuality, History, International Studies, Music, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology. In Mendoza:

Economics, Environmental Studies, History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Spanish

**Eligibility:** GPA 3.0; five semesters of college-level Spanish (one above the intermediate level) or equivalent for Buenos Aires; four semesters for Mendoza

**Dates:** Fall Semester: mid-July to mid-December (Argentine Semester II); Spring Semester: February to July (Argentina Semester I)

**Academic Program:** Students take the mandatory Spanish Language and Argentine Culture course and attend classes at Universidad Católica Argentina, Universidad de Buenos Aires, Universidad del Salvador, and Universidad Torcuato Di Tella in Buenos Aires, and in Mendoza, Universidad Nacional de Cuyo and Universidad de Congreso. The program also provides other optional courses and volunteer opportunities.

**Standard Course Load/Semester:** One or two program courses plus two to three university courses; or one program course, one university course, and a research project (in Buenos Aires)

**Housing and Meals:** Students live and eat with Argentine families.

**Billing:** Bryn Mawr tuition.

**Eligibility:** GPA 3.0; some faculties have additional entry requirements

**Dates:** Fall Semester (Australian Semester II): July to November; Spring Semester (Australian Semester I): February to June.

**Academic Program:** Students take courses (subjects) from up to four faculties (Faculty of Architecture, Building and Planning, Faculty of Arts, Faculty of Economics and Commerce, Faculty of Education, Faculty of Land and Food Resources, Faculty of Music, and Faculty of Science)

**Normal Course Load/Semester:** 50 points (4 subjects each worth 12.5 points) from up to four faculties

**Housing and Meals:** University dormitories, apartment complexes, or residential colleges. Students prepare their own meals in dormitories and apartments. Residential colleges include meal plans.

**Eligibility:** GPA 3.0; five semesters of college-level Spanish (one above the intermediate level) or equivalent for Santiago; four semesters for Valparaíso

**Dates:** Fall Semester: July to December (Chilean Semester II); Spring Semester (Chilean Semester I): February to July

**Academic Program:** Students take the mandatory Advanced Spanish and attend classes at Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile, Universidad de Chile, and Universidad Diego Portales in Santiago, and in Valparaíso, Pontificia Universidad Católica de Valparaíso and Universidad de Valparaíso.

The program also provides optional courses and volunteer opportunities.

**Standard Course Load/Semester:** One or two program courses plus three or four university courses

## CHINA, PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF

### **Program: CET Programs in Beijing or Harbin**

**Fields of Study:** Chinese language, Chinese Studies

**Eligibility:** GPA 3.0; no language pre-requisite for Beijing; four semesters of college level Chinese for Harbin.

**Dates:** Fall Semester: Late August to mid December; Spring Semester: February to late May

**Academic Program:** Beijing Chinese Language Program and Beijing Chinese Studies Program for beginning through advanced students; Harbin for high intermediate and advanced students. In Harbin, students take a total of 20 class hours per week all in Chinese. All students take a one-on-one course which offers advanced-intermediate and advanced students of Chinese the chance to explore in-depth topics of their own choosing. In addition, students are required to take a one-on-two course with a professor and one other student to improve fluency and address issues with pronunciation. Finally students choose two electives in an array of topics that include business, literature, composition, and classical Chinese. In the Beijing Chinese Language Program, students take a total of 20 class hours per week of core, supplementary and elective courses. All students have a one-hour individual tutorial each week to review new material and practice free response conversation. In addition, each week students take two hours of one-on-two instruction that targets pronunciation, intonation and fluency. Students in the Beijing Chinese Studies Program take the mandatory "21st Century Beijing" course and electives in Chinese history, politics, philosophy, literature and a service-learning course for a total of 16-20 class hours per week. In addition to these area studies courses, up to four levels of Chinese language are offered: beginning through advanced. All Chinese language courses are taught in Chinese, and area courses are taught in English.

**Normal Course Load/Semester:** 1 intensive language course, 1 elective course and practicum for Beijing Chinese Language Program; 1 Chinese language course, mandatory capstone course, and up to 2 area studies courses for Beijing Chinese Studies Program; 1 individual tutorial course, 1 one-on-two course, and 2 electives all in Chinese language for Harbin Chinese Language Program.

**Housing and Meals:** Beijing Chinese Language Program: either a double room with a Chinese roommate, or a single room at the western branch campus of Beijing Institute of Education; weekday lunch in dining hall. Harbin Chinese Language Program: a double room with a Chinese roommate in the international student dormitory of the Harbin Institute of Technology; students are responsible for their meals. Beijing Chinese Studies Program: in an international student dormitory on the Capital Normal University campus; students are responsible for their meals.

**Billing:** Bryn Mawr tuition.

**Program: CIEE in Shanghai (Provisional Approval)**

**Academic Programs:** The China in a Global Context Program is designed for students with no Chinese language background and those who have studied Chinese for several semesters. The program offers Chinese language training at both standard and intensive levels coupled with coursework, taught in English, in global studies, economics, international relations, and area studies. **Dates:** Single semester. Fall Semester: early September to mid-December; Spring Semester: early February to mid-May

**Academic Program:** Students take four course courses: *Fundamentals of Tropical Biology*, *Environmental Science and Policy of the Tropics*, *Field Research in Tropical Biology*, and *Spanish Language and Latin American Culture*. Science courses are taught by Duke and OTS faculty as well as visiting scientists. Students spent time in San Jose (for intensive Spanish Language and Latin American Culture) and each of OTS's three field stations over the course of their stay.

**Normal Course Load/Semester:** 4 courses

**Housing and Meals:** Three-week of homestays in San Jose. Dormitory style housing and dining hall style food accommodations are available at field sites; tents occasionally.

## CZECH REPUBLIC

**Program:** Collegium Hieronymi Pragensis, Prague (*Direct Admissions*)

**Eligibility:** GPA 3.0

**Dates:** Fall Semester: late August to mid-December; Spring Semester: mid-January to mid-May

**Academic Program:** Instruction is in English. The program starts with a two-week core course session that consists of two courses, *Czech Culture and Civilization* and an intensive conversational course of Czech language *Let's Talk Czech*. The first two weeks are followed by regular courses. Formal lectures are taught by Czech professors and supplemented by small group tutorials and seminars, laboratory work, field work and independent research. The program also organizes excursions through Bohemia.

**Normal Course Load/Semester:** Core course session plus four regular courses, one of which is the regular course of Elementary Czech.

**Housing and Meals:** Students are accommodated in Jerome House in mostly singles with private bathrooms. Some rooms are grouped in suites with four rooms and two shared bathrooms. Students prepare their own meals.

**Billing:** Bryn Mawr tuition.

## DENMARK

A program is defined as one or two core courses that normally include one or two course-integrated study tours (one short regional study tour early in the semester and one longer European study tour during the first week of the three-week travel break). The study tours of all programs usually take place simultaneously, so normally students sign up for only one DIS program.

**Normal Course Load/Semester:** 15 credits

**Housing and Meals:** Students can live with a host family with breakfasts and dinners provided, in a dorm and prepare their own meals, or get independent housing

**Academic Program:** Students can participate in either Area Studies and Language Program or Direct Enrollment Program. Students in the Area Studies and Language Program take a core course and a Spanish language course and select the remainder of their courses from area studies courses at IES, Pontificia Universidad Católica del Ecuador or Facultad Latinoamericana de Ciencias Sociales. ## ENGLAND, UNITED KINGDOM

**Program Name:** Sotheby's Institute of Art – London

**Eligibility:** GPA 3.0 and above

**Dates:** Fall Semester: early September to mid-December; Spring semester: mid- January to early May

**Academic Programs: (1) Art and Business:** This intensive one-semester course is designed for those who are interested both in art history and the business practices of the art world. Through lectures and visits to specialist museums and collections, students are introduced to the history of art and design and the ways in which art has been made, sold and collected. In the Fall semester students focus on Modern and Contemporary art. The business component of the course starts with fundamentals and examines the history, management and legal ramifications of both public and private art organizations, and the international art market and its workings. Students explore legal issues related to the art market and the relationship between contemporary management theories and the art world. Established and emerging markets also are considered. The course offers practical skills connected to accessing and analyzing art market data.

**(2) Foundations of Western Art:** In this full-immersion semester course students explore the history and development of art in the western world from ancient Greek beginnings to the present day. Students acquire a sound understanding of key stylistic developments, methods, materials and techniques, and they investigate the worlds of artistic production, patronage and consumption in successive centuries. The course also gives considerable attention to the broader social, political and cultural contexts which defined the shape of artistic achievement across a very long period. The course is introductory but intensive, and requires no prior knowledge of the field. It is suitable for students interested in acquiring a strong foundation in western art history. It also serves as a gateway course for students with an undergraduate degree in a subject other than art history who may be considering applying for a postgraduate programme at Sotheby's Institute.

**(3) Decorative Art and Design:** This intensive one-semester course combines an examination of the historical and stylistic development of Western European decorative arts, design and interiors of the late 17<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> centuries, with an introduction to the professional world of working with objects from these centuries. It is aimed at those who wish to gain knowledge of the decorative arts and those interested in interior design.

The decorative arts are studied in relation to architecture and interiors, as well as in their wider social and historical context.

Topics include the court art of Louis XIV, the development of porcelain at Meissen and Sèvres, the influence of trade with the East, and the renewed interest in antiquity at the end of the eighteenth century. Nineteenth-century topics include design reformers such as Pugin and William Morris, as well as the impact of Japanese design in Europe. In the twentieth century, the Art Deco style is studied alongside Modernism. The course concludes with an exploration of the plurality of approaches of recent decades, including Pop, Postmodernism and Conceptual Design.

The teaching approach emphasizes object-based learning, enabling students to gain confidence in analyzing and identifying a wide range of art objects, both in a classroom setting and in numerous study visits to London's world-class collections. There are also visits to country houses, dealers and previews of relevant auction sales including Sotheby's, as well as a field trip to Paris. Students meet museum curators, auction house specialists and decorative art and design dealers.

**(4) Arts of Asia:** In this intensive course students acquire an understanding of the extraordinarily rich artistic traditions of the leading religions and philosophies of Asia. These include Islam, Hinduism, Jainism and early Buddhism in India, Southeast Asia and the Islamic World, as well as Daoism, Confucianism, Shinto and Mahayana Buddhism in China, Korea and Japan. Artistic developments on the Asian continent are explored across a very long period, from 4500 BC to the present day. The secular and religious, the monumental and miniature are considered in the geographical area ranging from Japan to the Near East. The unusual geographical breadth of this course enables students to make comparisons and contrasts between varying types of art, and to understand the role of transmission across different artistic cultures. Students explore the contexts in which art was and is produced, investigating themes such as court life of the Indian and Persian sultanates and the Mughals; civil and military East Asian court life; and the European opening-up of trade with China and Japan from the sixteenth century onwards. The course concludes with a review of contemporary art and its markets in India, Iran, Southeast Asia, China and Japan.

**Normal Course Load/Semester:** 16 credits (60 UK upper level undergraduate credits)

**Housing and Meals:** Students are responsible for organizing their own accommodation and meals.

**Academic Program:**

SOAS offers more than 450 fully integrated Study Abroad courses and students are free to choose courses from across the different departments to create their own unique program of study; some focusing on a particular region, others on a particular discipline. Popular subject areas include Development Studies, Politics, Law, Economics, History, Study of Religions and Music. The School also offers an unparalleled range of non-European languages including Chinese, Japanese, Arabic, Hebrew, Thai and Swahili.
