Approval to study abroad is formally granted by the Study Abroad Committee, and the Major Adviser Evaluation Form is an important factor in the evaluation process. Students should discuss their study abroad plans, including both program choice and semester of study, with their major advisor in advance of applying for approval to study abroad. The **Major Adviser Evaluation Form is due by the application deadline of February 15th** and can be accessed on BiONIC through two different links (via the Major Work Plan or the BMC Students Menu).
