Caste is a codified social hierarchy that affects over 1 billion people worldwide. With its origins in Hindu scripture, this system has led to countless acts of oppression and discrimination against those deemed "lower" caste. People outside caste structures go by the term Dalit (meaning: "broken but resilient") and Adivasis, the indigenous peoples of South Asia. Casteism permeates societies across the globe, and the movement led by Equality Labs aims to fight it with direct, radical activism.
