

## **Policy on Reporting Other Support for NIH Proposals**

The NIH requires disclosure of all resources made available to a researcher in support of and/or related to any of their research endeavors, regardless of whether they have monetary value and regardless of whether they are based at Bryn Mawr College

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Other Support Disclosures must include ALL active and pending sources, including:

- **Sponsored projects/proposals** (including subawards, contract agreements, etc.)
- **External consulting**, when an investigator will be involved in the design, conduct, or reporting of research as part of the consulting activities (e.g., work that may result in publication in an academic journal, designing a protocol, data analysis, serving on a steering committee for a clinical trial)
- **In-kind** (i.e., non-monetary) resources that meet all the following criteria:
  - Are uniquely available to the researcher, and
  - Were provided by a non-BMC entity (either domestic or foreign), and
  - Were provided in the past three years, and
  - Are not being used on the proposed project.
- **In-kind** resources include, but are not limited to:
  - Personnel (e.g., visiting scholars, visiting students, visiting lab support or trainees, volunteers); Space; Equipment; Materials; Supplies

**Note:** In-kind resources intended for use on the proposed project should be included as part of the 'Facilities and Other Resources' or 'Equipment' section of the application and not 'Other Support'

- **Active/Pending** sponsored project total award amount (for subawards to BMC, the total subaward amount needs to be included)
